I can't count the times an errant basketball bounced over the fence, which Art kindly retrieved for us. He never complained when we jumped over the fence to retrieve the ball when he wasn't outside, or when he had to patch up the fence due to our actions, or when an errant hockey ball went near his car. Yet, the memory that comes to mind the strongest is the ladder he built for me and my childhood friends.

You see, I often played with a few younger kids near me, visiting one friend that happened to live behind our house that shared a fence with Art. Each day, we climbed the fence to visit one another, having to step on the tops of his corner fence to reach our destination. With all of the fence jumping activity, it would have been perfectly reasonable for Art to become frustrated and yell at us, or devise ways to prevent us from visiting one another by using his property. Instead, he built us a ladder to make it easier. A perfectly crafted step ladder appeared one day, with a corner platform, making the path for me and my friends easier and much safer. It was there just for us - a secret entrance hidden behind my garage. The visits increased and that ladder served us for a great many years and helped to craft many memories.
