“ I'm Jason Barnoski. When I discovered that it was "time" for my grandmother exactly 7 days before, I promised her that I would visit her every single day until she was ready. About a week before that, I asked my best friend if I could go to an event with her. And the time I went was the night before grandma left. That night, as I was heading over to the event, I called her just to make up the visit. I called my Dad who was at my grandmothers house and I said to him that I wanted to talk to her to say goodnight. I didn't realize after a week later that God told me to call her.

Before that, during that night, I was talking to Dad for a little bit talking about the day. Then later I had him passing the phone to her with my Dad holding his phone over grandma's deathbed on speaker. I gave the simple "Goodnight grandma, I love you." As I did every night when I used to call her for her to take her medication about a year and a half ago every night around 8.

She lost her speech over the week for her final moments so I thought she wasn't gonna be able to talk anymore and I wasn't going to hear anything.

Then I heard a faint "I love you." And my heart got happy knowing there was something in her left. Then something incredible, she yelled "I LOVE YOU!" And it was as clear as can be. And it was the most unexpected thing ever. It was the most amazing thing.

Me and my Dad still talk about her to this day. And I hope we do for a very long time.
