We'd start with a cup of tea (more like a cup of milk with a splash of tea for me), then off we'd go to pick up my grandmother on the way to the little Ukranian church in Manville. After mass, we'd take grandma home, then we'd stop on the way to our Piscataway home to pick up the Sunday paper and donuts from the bakery to eat for breakfast. This Sunday ritual has played a huge role in my faith as an adult, and has instilled in me the importance of raising your children in the faith. Dad worked hard, but never allowed his job to get in the way of his family. He had dinner with us every night. I remember him teaching me to how to handle a bow and arrow, to swim, and to play horseshoes. His work ethic runs from generation to generation - all the Shotyk children (and grandchildren) are hard workers. Dad would tirelessly help everyone who needed it. He loved and cherished all his grandchildren. He accepted my two adopted children as his own from the moment we walked off the plane with them. My dad was my hero, my friend, and the best dad a girl could ask for - I will miss him terribly and I will love him always.
