“ I have known Bob since the summer of 1977 when we worked together at The Hollywood Wax Museum. We became close friends and over the years I would visit him at his basement apartment in Montclair around Christmas and we would go into the city and we always went to see a show on Broadway. I saw the Magnificent Christmas Spectacular at Radio City Music Hall with him in 1979. Between 1978 and 1982 he spent every Christmas Eve at Morning Glory Ave where Anita & I lived. In 1995 he was my best man when I got married for the 2nd time. He organized the best bachelor party for me I ever could have imagined. We lost touch for a number of years due to both of us moving around, but then we reconnected about 5 years ago and it was like we just picked our friendship right back up. In 2019 he came down here to Florida to attend my youngest daughter's wedding. The day after the wedding, he & I went to see a christmas concert at the high school all my kids went to and he thought it was a great performance. In 2020 I was up north and stayed with him for 7 weeks at his house. We went down to Wildwood 3 times during that period and were visiting Anita, my 1st wife, and we went up to the boardwalk together and marvelled at how much everything had changed in Wildwood. We went down to Cape May during 1 of those trips as well. He and I were going to Europe for a month next fall. We had been talking about it for over a year. At the end of July of this year, I had asked him to do me a favor and help me move Anita from Wildwood to my home in Melbourne, Fl. Of course, being the great friend he was, he agreed to drive my car and I drove the truck. He stayed at my house until August 17th and then we went to the airport together, me going to California because Heather was having her 1st baby, and Bob going home to New Jersey. In that airport was the last time I saw my best friend. I had called and left messages, but just today found out he passed away. I loved this man and I will miss him dearly

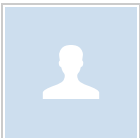
